Eligibility:	<p>This scholarship is awarded once a year to a Native American college and technical student of any age, any tribe and in any state who has financial need and a minimum GPA of 3.25 based on a 4.0 scale or the equivalent GPA on the scaled used by the applicable educational institution.</p> <p>Applicants must be Native Americans and must be able to prove membership in a tribe that is recognized at a state and/or federal level. These awards are available for vocational training or college/university undergraduate or graduate students. Preference is given to undergraduate applicants.</p>

Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR): Frances Crawford Marvin American Indian Scholarship

Amount:	The amount of scholarship is based on total return of the endowment, and may vary year to year.

Students must demonstrate financial need, academic achievement, and have a 3.25 GPA or higher. A recipient may reapply for this scholarship and be considered along with other members of the applicant pool.</p>

Scholarship renewal is contingent upon maintaining good academic standing, maintaining full-time enrollment and a minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA. • Prior receipt of a scholarship does not guarantee a future academic year scholarship.
