
Freshman students are in their first semester at IBC, whether traditional freshmen or transfers.

Creative Ways to Contribute

Did you know that more than one quarter of gifts to Indigenous Bible College come from DAFs, estate gifts, or IRAs? These creative giving methods come with benefits to both you and the college!

A Gift From Your IRA

Did you know that if you are 73 or older, you can directly transfer some or all of your required minimum distribution (RMD) to the charity or charities of your choice without paying tax on withdrawal? This popular gift option is known as a qualified charitable distribution (QCD). Any gift, whether \$100 or \$108,000 (the maximum for 2025), can help lower your tax bill while supporting the mission of IBC.

Giving Through a Donor Advised Fund

A Donor Advised Fund (DAF) is a savings account you create to fund your annual charitable giving. These funds are a convenient way to support IBC while making your gifts eligible for an immediate tax deduction. You can learn more about DAFs at bit.ly/47Pe3QK.

Legacy Giving & Estate Gifts

Estate gifts create an opportunity for donors to have a lasting impact on the causes they care about. Including IBC as a beneficiary in your will is a great way to support the long-term mission of the college for decades to come! Legacy gifts can also be designated for particular programs or projects at IBC that you care about.

Gifts of Stock or Mutual Funds

Donating stock or mutual funds is another smart way to support the mission of IBC. These kinds of donations allow you to save on capital gains taxes *and* claim a tax deduction on the full value of the shares or mutual funds you donate.



Celebrating IBC's New Fitness Center!

In April 2018, IBC's campus expanded with the purchase of a neighboring building, which now serves as our student center and library. The property came with a detached side building, which IBC staff and volunteers have worked diligently to convert into a fitness center over the past four years.

The process was delayed numerous times by permitting issues and building plan delays but the work proceeded gradually, aided by an abundance of help from the Lord's people. Over the past four years, over 50 maintenance volunteers generously provided over 700 hours in donated labor to replace the building's roof, install insulation, drywall and electricity, reconstruct the floor and ceiling, and paint the building's interior. With their help, we were able to dedicate and open the completed fitness center to the IBC community on September 9th.



The new facility offers 11 pieces of gym equipment, medicine balls, free weights, exercise bands, and a traverse wall (completed in 2023). It is designed to be enjoyed by people of all fitness and experience levels and to remove cost- and distance-related barriers for students as they steward their health and wellbeing. We are deeply grateful to the many generous individuals, churches, and foundations who contributed to the creation of this space. It was received with so much excitement by the students and is being used on daily basis! What a gift!
